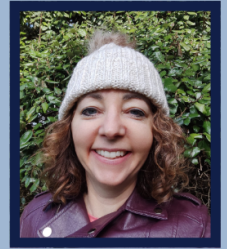

## Parashat Tetzaveh

8 Adar 5785/ 8 March 2025



### ZAKHOR - REMEMBER

This is the Shabbat when we collectively recall an event, in which Amalek attacked us after the exodus.

Why have we not forgiven this people after all this time? Egypt enslaved us for many decades and while we are required to daily remember Yetziat Mitzrayim, we are not obligated to remember the evil of Egypt. In the entire Jewish tradition, there is no other people who we are commanded to oppose so vehemently.

Rashi ([Deut 25](#)) quotes the Midrash:

"Asher karkha - (karkha is related to the Hebrew word 'kar' - cold): Amalek cooled you down from your boiling state. When you came out of Egypt, all the nations were terrified. They dared not initiate an attack against you. But Amalek took the plunge and lead the way for others. It may be compared to a bath of boiling water which no being can enter due to its heat. One lunatic jumped in. Though he gets scalded he has cooled the bath for others."

Nechama Leibowitz explains that the miracles of Egypt had come to publicise the exclusive power of God. All the nations except for Amalek were seized with awe.

Mankind might have taken one great step forward and acknowledged the sovereignty of God. But along came Amalek - unrestrained by the dread and awe that kept all the nations of the world in check - jumped into the boiling cauldron. The moment of awe at the mighty hand of God passed and the atmosphere of astonishment at his miracles evaporated. The world returned to ... the idols of gold and silver, its faith in mortal power and brute force.

This is why God has a war against Amalek. Amalek do not fear God. They believe in their own power; the power of weapons and human force. They attack Israel even though they will be hurt, scalded by the boiling heat. Why? Because Israel carry the name of God with them as they march triumphantly away from the Red Sea. Amalek cannot withstand this Divine world view. They wish to tarnish this pristine image of God in the world. God holds it against them for ever.

Parents are reminded that the Megillah reading must be clearly heard by all adults. Please do not bring young children to Shul if they will cause disruption. We have arranged several Megillah readings so that childcare arrangements can be made.

The mitzvos of Purim are to enhance the simcha and celebration of the day for yourself and those around you. Every person should have a festive seuda during the course of Purim day. The minimal requirements are that hamotzi should be made and an additional food be added. The seuda can be any time of day, however this year when Purim is a Friday, it is preferable that the meal starts before halachic midday (12:10pm) and is completed before plag Hamincha (16.49pm)

“משנכנס אדר מרבין בשמחה” – when Adar arrives, we increase our simcha (Ta’anis 29a). Nevertheless, we need to be careful and not create unnecessary risks to ourselves and others, especially at this time of heightened tensions. Special sensitivity in costumes and behaviour is appropriate. Be aware of where your children are and what they are doing throughout the day. We all hope that before next year we will be celebrating together in rebuilt Yerushalayim with Shalom around us all.

### Shabbos Parashas Zachor – 8<sup>th</sup> March 2025

Every Jewish adult has a Torah obligation to hear the reading of Parashas Zachor, which records Amalek’s attack on the Jewish people on their way out of Egypt, in order to fulfil the mitzvah of remembering Amalek and obliterating their name. This mitzvah is best accomplished by listening to Parashas Zachor read from a kosher Sefer Torah with a minyan.

The EAYC will be offering additional opportunities for hearing the leining of Parashas Zachor on its own on Shabbos after davening.

Those who did not yet hear Parshas Zachor from a Sefer Torah on Shabbos Zachor can also fulfil the mitzvah hearing the Torah leining on Purim morning. Anyone unable to attend shul, can fulfil the mitzvah (according to some opinions) by reading Parashas Zachor (Devarim 25:17-19) from a Chumash.

### Zecher l’Machatzis HaShekel

During the time of the Beis Hamikdash, all shared in public karbonos and the Beis Hamikdash activities by donating a half shekel. Today, when we sadly are no longer able to do so, the minhag is to donate 3 half coins (50p coins) of the realm in remembrance of this by Ta’anis Esther evening. Some do this on behalf of each member of the family. It is not necessary to actually directly lift the coins to fulfil this minhag. The requirement for this begins at age 20 but many do so from bar/bas mitzvah age. ### Ta’anis Esther – Thursday, 13<sup>th</sup> March 2025

Anyone who is healthy should fast as usual. If you are ill in any way or are finding fasting difficult, consult with the Rav. Best by booking a time [here](#). If attending a later megillah reading, it is permitted to have a snack beforehand.

The hafsa is 4.42am and the Taanis ends and Purim begins at 18.56.

### Purim – Thursday night 13<sup>th</sup> March – Friday 14<sup>th</sup> March 2025 - The Mitzvos

#### Megillas Esther

Both men and women are obligated to hear megillah, both Thursday night (after nightfall 18.56pm) and during Friday day (preferably after 06.19am in the morning and before shkia at 18.03pm in the evening).

The EAYC will be offering numerous megillah readings. **Details and times on the Purim timetable.** We should strive to hear the Meggila with the community to fulfil מלך הדרת עם ברוב and with a proper minyan to hear the final brocha. If attending a late megillah reading, it is permitted to have a snack beforehand.

For those who are not able to come to shul:

- If you have a kosher megillah:
  - o If you are able to read it at home –do so from the megillah, on behalf of yourself and any household members who may be listening. It is fine to have someone reading along from a printed megillah or correcting any mispronounced words.
  - o If you are not able to read it on your own – you may read from a kosher megillah alongside a ba’al koreh who is reading on a recording or over Zoom. You will then fulfil the mitzvah with your leining.

In these cases – you should make all three brochos before reading the megillah, with everyone else present answering Amen. (The brocho after the megillah reading is only said in the presence of a minyan).

- If you don’t have a kosher megillah and are unable to attend in person a megillah leining, please consult with Rabbi Lieberman directly. Best to book a short zoom/phone time [here](#). You can also contact the Shul office and we will endeavour to arrange someone to come and lein for you.

## Purim Seuda (This year being Friday)

The mitzvos of Purim are to enhance the simcha and celebration of the day for yourself and those around you. Every person should have a festive seuda during the course of Purim day (a meal at night does not fulfil this mitzva). The minimal requirements are that hamotzi should be made and an additional food be added. The seuda can be any time of day including for breakfast. This year when Purim is a Friday, it is preferable that the meal starts before halachic midday (12:10pm) and is completed before plag Hamincha (16.49pm) to enable eating the Shabbos seudah with an appetite. This is the correct traditional minhag as brought in the Ramo and Poskim. Some permit starting later in the day but limiting what you eat to a kebeitza (egg size amount) of challa and a bit of meat and completing the seudah before Shabbos with sufficient time to have an appetite for seudas Shabbos.

In extenuating circumstances there is an alternative, though many poskim strongly disagree with this and it is best avoided if at all possible. The process for this is: On Friday afternoon after having davened Mincha and completing all Shabbos preparations, you wash for bread, eat at least a kezayis and begin the Purim seudah. If you have not completed the seudah before Shabbos begins, light candles by the correct time (17.48) and begin Shabbos. All Shabbos dinnim then begin. Before eating further and by shkia (sunset 18.01) cover the challah (lechem mishna) that is on the table and make Kiddush as normal. If you have already made a brocha on wine at the seudah you do not say borei pri hagefen, though you do hold a full cup of wine when reciting the kiddush. The meal then continues with the lechem mishna, though no additional brochah is made. You must make sure to then eat an additional kebeitza (egg size) of challah. When bentching you should say both Al Hanissim for Purim and Retzai for Shabbos. (Some say to recite Retzai only in bentching and add Al hanissim as a Horachamon towards the end of bentching.) Remember to daven Kabbolas Shabbos and Maariv after the seudah. Aveilim participate in a Purim Seudah as they do every year, Preferably in their own home.

## Mishloach Manos

The mitzvah of Mishloach Manos requires every Jewish adult to send at least **two items of ready-to-eat food to another Jewish adult outside your household**. This must be done during the day of Purim (not at night-time). Although many of us enjoy giving gifts to many people, this is not a halachic requirement.


We should remember the Rambam's comments, "It is preferable for a person to be more liberal with Mattanos l'evyonim than to be lavish in his preparation of the Purim feast or in sending portions to his friends. There is no greater and more splendid happiness than to gladden the hearts of the poor, the orphans, the widows, and the converts. One who brings happiness to the hearts of these unfortunate individuals resembles the Divine Presence, which Isaiah 57:15 describes as having the tendency 'to revive the spirit of the lowly and to revive those with broken hearts.'"

Aveilim give a minimum Mishloach Manos but do not receive. Family may receive on their behalf.

## Matanos la'evyonim

Every person is required to give money of at least a nominal sum to two needy people on Purim day (not at night). You may prearrange for someone to distribute on your behalf on Purim day. For this reason, funds can be provided online, and in advance (either online or by sending a cheque, voucher or cash). Rabbi Lieberman alongside other Edgware Rabbonim will be collecting and distributing Matanos la'evyonim to local needy families on Purim on your behalf,
